1 COMMITTEE MEETINGS

1.1 GENERAL RULES

In general, but as you already know, we ask all of you to be at your utter best, and to be considerate of other committee members their opinion. You have chosen a subject in which opinions vary a lot and you are expected to act accordingly.

However, some rules need to be explained further. The presidency expects you to treat them with respect and act upon the courtesy rules. These include, but are not limited to:

Formalities:

1. Raising of the placard

During the committee meetings (and the GA) you are only allowed to express your opinion on the matter if you have been given the word. It is considered rude to speak without being acknowledged.

2. Standing up

When acknowledged, you stand up to express your opinion.

3. Thanking for the word/floor

After standing up, you will thank the presidency for acknowledging you. Standing up without thanking the presidency will most definitely put you in a bad spot.

4. Addressing the presidency

When given the word, you speak towards the presidency, and will refer to other delegates by saying 'the delegate of */country/*.

5. Blazers

When standing up, your blazer is closed. When sitting, it is open. You are allowed to take off your blazer when the presidency has done so. Not before this moment.

6. Attires

A fine delegate respects the clothing rules. Wearing sneakers is not done.







Electronic devices:

During the committee meetings the usage of E-devices will be prohibited, this to ensure that everybody focusses on what is important and to make sure that there are no unnecessary diversions.

However, we believe that for some occasions it will be needed to use your E-device, such as for the research you need on your subject. We know that it is not always as easy to leave your phones and other devices out of eyesight, but we will still ask you to do respect this rule. After all, well prepared members of the LIBE committee, don't need to check their computer every other minute to have inspiration.

For research purposes you will be able to use your device as mentioned before, this means that you will still need an electrical device to do so. your phone may suffice, but if you feel like using your iPad or laptop feel free to do so too.

These devices, will not be used in Al context! Be original and find solutions for problems close to your heart. A computer will not give your resolution the desired outcome.

Communication:

For official communication such as transferring documents, Teams will be used. The link for our Teams group will be included further on in the prep module.

You will also be added to a WhatsApp group with us, but we will also ask you to make a group without us for communication for which our opinion isn't needed.

We will ask you to prepare a POV, which is a small document in which you prepare how you feel about this topic and what you want the future to look like concerning the problems that we will discuss.

We only ask for your opinions so please limit the POV to one page maximum. There is no minimum as long as your opinion is clear and well structured. Feel free to be creative in your way to express yourself, but keep it professional.

This document will show us how prepared and informed you are and how well your opinion can be supported with facts. So we not only ask for your opinion, but also: why and how.

You will have to mail your POV by 12/02/2024.
